1. About the project –

In the project - Ensure right on health with women, s & girls & sustainable livelihoods, supported by Share & Care foundation, 2022, project activities were organized according to the objectives of the project like – monthly village level meeting with peer leaders/ Educators, Identify Volunteer to empower women's through legal rights and gender equality in each village, Training on preparation of sanitary napkins, Training on sewing and handmask preparation, Networking & Co- ordination meeting , Quarterly review meeting with PIT & Peer Leaders Six monthly impact assessment & livelihood awareness. Trained to 75 trainees on hand mask, sanitary napkin and sewing product and supported awareness

2. Project Objectives –

☐ To ensure the income generation opportunities on sustainable livelihood for rural women's in project villages .

☐ To create opportunities for partnerships of rural women with the civil society during social events.

☐ To ensure the active participation of govt. department and health department during health camp , meeting and trainings at project area ☐ To educate rural women/ girls on their constitutional and legal rights and privileges.

Outcomes –

- Trained groups members are manufacturing product like as- Sanitary napkin pad, clothSewing&mask making.
- Responsibilities decided to conduct health checkup camp in selected villages.
- Action plan prepared for next quarter months for issue based efforts.Women are preparing sanitary Napkin and sewing product and selling at local and near by cities.
- The women member of the groups have started saving and inter loaning. Monthly meetingsare conducting in groups and need based different issues are discussed.
- Smt. Asha Devi vill- BeedGanwar has opened a cosmetic product soap by taking loan fromthe group, from which she has earned of 7000 rupees in a month.
- Women and Girls have earned an average of Rs 2200 per group by selling sanitary napkinproducts in this quarter.
- Trained women prepared different designing women dress and earned 1200/- monthly.
- Peer leader are helping the women for quantity and quality purpose of sanitary Napkin ,Sewing and other handicraft items and linkages are strengthening with others.
- Planned for next quarter to conduct training in villages on soap and surf making productsor

economic empowerment..

40 trainees participated in Sanitary napkin training program from 10 villages.

□ All trainees learnt to prepare sanitary napkin product and got details about raw material, market demand and production system.

□ Sanitary napkin product prepared as per direction by Master trainer.

□ All trainees used the product made by self and they felt good & decided to manufacture of finish goods at their home .

□ Govt. Deptt. Office of Director Principle Investigator, Instt. of Digital Education &

Employment Development distributed training certificates to all trainees. They were glad and decided to earn income generation activities.

Nutrition about the kids

Vitamin Angel

Objective:

The primary objective of the awareness campaign conducted by Vitamin Angel GVSTK “CSO” in Gram Panchayat Barol and Malikpur was to educate caregivers and community members about the importance of nutrition, particularly focusing on millets and Vitamin A, for the health and well-being of infants aged 6 months to 5 years. The campaign aimed to raise awareness about the benefits of incorporating millets into the diet of infants and highlight the significance of Vitamin A in preventing nutritional deficiencies and promoting overall health.



Outcomes:

1. **Increased Awareness:** The campaign significantly raised awareness among caregivers and community members about the importance of nutrition for infant health, with a specific focus on millets and Vitamin A.
2. **Behavioral Change:** There was a noticeable shift in dietary practices, with an increase in the consumption of millet-based meals among infants aged 6 months to 5 years. Caregivers reported a greater understanding of the nutritional value of millets and actively incorporated them into their daily cooking routines.
3. **Community Engagement:** The campaign fostered community engagement and collaboration, with active participation from local authorities, volunteers, and caregivers. This collective effort enhanced the sustainability of nutrition-focused initiatives at the village level.

Community support Program

Goonj India

Objective:

The primary objective of the community support program implemented by Goonj India GVSTK in collaboration with four Gram Panchayats was to empower communities to undertake sustainable development activities while addressing immediate needs through the distribution of essential items to vulnerable families. The program aimed to foster community participation in initiatives such as pond digging, road clearing, school ground cleaning, and conservation of village-level natural resources, thereby promoting self-reliance and collective action.



Activities Implemented:

Community Development Projects:

Pond Digging: Engaging community members in digging ponds to enhance water conservation efforts and improve access to water for irrigation and household use.

Road Clearing: Mobilizing villagers to clear roads, improving connectivity, and facilitating easier access to essential services and markets.

School Ground Cleaning: Collaborating with schools and local volunteers to clean and maintain school grounds, creating safe and hygienic spaces for children to play and learn.

Natural Resource Conservation: Promoting sustainable practices for the preservation of village-level natural resources, such as tree planting, waste management, and soil conservation.

Community Engagement Workshops: Conducting workshops and training sessions to raise awareness about the importance of community-led development initiatives, emphasizing the role of collective action in addressing local challenges and fostering self-reliance.

Needs Assessment and Distribution:

Conducting thorough needs assessments to identify vulnerable families within the communities.

Distributing power kits comprising essential items such as clothes, blankets, mosquito nets, and mats to 350 identified families to address immediate needs and improve their quality of life.

Capacity Building:

Providing skill-building opportunities and training programs to empower community members with the knowledge and resources necessary to sustainably manage and maintain the infrastructure developed through the program.

Facilitating workshops on income-generating activities and livelihood opportunities to promote economic empowerment and resilience among community members.

Outcomes:

Community Empowerment: The program empowered communities to take ownership of their development by actively participating in various projects aimed at improving infrastructure and conserving natural resources management .

Improved Living Conditions: The distribution of power kits to 350 vulnerable families contributed to improving their living conditions by addressing immediate needs for clothing, bedding, and protection against mosquito-borne diseases.

Enhanced Community Cohesion: Collaborative efforts in undertaking community development projects fostered a sense of solidarity and mutual support among villagers, strengthening social cohesion and resilience.

Sustainable Development: The program laid the foundation for sustainable development by promoting community-led initiatives focused on environmental conservation, infrastructure development, and economic empowerment.

Capacity Building: Training programs and skill-building workshops equipped community members with the knowledge and skills necessary to continue managing and maintaining the projects initiated under the program, ensuring their long-term sustainability.

SAFE VILLAGE PROGRAM

Objective:

The "Safe Village" program, conducted by GVSTK in collaboration with My Choice Foundation, aimed to promote safety and well-being among children in Tonk and Ajmer districts through awareness campaigns conducted in schools. The primary objectives of the program were to educate children about concepts such as Good Touch-Bad Touch, Child Trafficking, and Financial Literacy using engaging methods such as street plays (Nukkad Natak) and movies.



Activities Implemented:

Awareness Workshops in Schools: Conducting interactive workshops in schools to educate children about personal safety, including understanding the difference between good touch and bad touch.

Providing age-appropriate information on child trafficking and how to recognize and respond to potential dangers.

Nukkad Natak (Street Plays): Organizing street plays in communities and schools to raise awareness about important safety issues in a culturally relevant and engaging manner.

Using drama and storytelling to convey messages about personal safety, child trafficking, and financial literacy to both children and adults.

Movie Screenings:

Arranging screenings of educational movies focusing on child safety and financial literacy in schools and community centers.

Facilitating discussions after the screenings to reinforce key messages and address any questions or concerns from the audience.

Collaboration with Schools and Communities:

Partnering with local schools and community leaders to ensure the effective delivery of awareness programs and to encourage community participation.

Engaging parents and caregivers through parent-teacher meetings and community events to reinforce the importance of child safety and financial education.

Program Locations:

Tonk District: 25 awareness programs conducted.

Ajmer District: 13 awareness programs conducted.

Outcomes:

Increased Awareness: The program successfully increased awareness among children about personal safety, including recognizing and responding to inappropriate behavior (Good Touch-Bad Touch).

Empowerment: Children gained knowledge and skills to protect themselves from potential risks such as child trafficking, enabling them to make informed decisions and seek help when needed.

Community Engagement: The involvement of schools, community leaders, and parents fostered a collaborative approach to child safety and financial education, creating a supportive environment for children to learn and grow.

Behavioural Change: The use of interactive methods such as street plays and movies facilitated a positive change in attitudes and behaviours related to personal safety and financial literacy among children and their families.

Sustainability: By building partnerships with local stakeholders and integrating awareness activities into school curricula, the program laid the groundwork for sustained efforts to promote child safety and financial education in the communities.
